## **PRESENTATION**

On November 14 and 15, 2019, the *II International Congress of*Fantastic Genre, Audiovisuals and New Technologies was held at the Congress Center of the town of Elche (Alicante, Spain). An activity of scientific and academic dissemination, integrated into the *International Elche International Fantastic Film Festival - FANTAELX*, and developed in collaboration with the Miguel Hernández University, whose main objective is the dissemination of research studies in different areas of the Fantastic Genre.

While preparing the celebration of the next edition of the Congress and the Festival, which will take place from November 12 to 14, 2020, below, we offer below a summary of the **results and publications related to this second event**.





## I. PAPERS

The second edition of the Congress had the participation of **35 invited** speakers and researchers of national and international character, coming from centers such as the University of Aix-Marseille (France), the Catholic University of Leuven (Belgium), the Lumière Lyon 2 University (France), the Pompeu Fabra University (Barcelona), the Michoacana University of San Nicolás de Hidalgo (Mexico), the University of Nueva Granada (Colombia), the Official Center for Higher Studies Barreira Art + Design (Valencia), the University of Murcia, or the Miguel Hernández University of Elche, among others.

In addition to investigating the Fantastic Genre and its possible connections with the various platforms of culture, audiovisual and new technologies, the main theme of the second edition of the Congress was **Science-Fiction in the cosmological context and its possible connection with the various platforms of culture, audiovisual and new technologies**. For this reason, there were a total of **17 talks and 15 research papers**, which addressed the field of the fantastic from topics and perspectives as diverse as comics, literature, cinematography, video games, TV series, teaching methodologies, advertising, History, plastic arts, or sociology, among other areas.






## **III. DIGITAL BOOK IN ENGLISH**
